- ❖ Varsity Track 1950-51
- ❖ Four year scholarship to Rice University 1951-54
 - Played mostly left tackle for the Owls
 - Played in the Cotton Bowl Championship Game in 1954 and a team that finished the season ranked 19th
 - Played against NFL greats Bart Starr, Roosevelt Grier, Forrest Gregg, and Wee Willie Davis
- ❖ Signed as a free agent with the Philadelphia Eagles

While he loved the game of football, it ended up causing many dire consequences. Since he suffered a total of 30 concussions over his 8 year playing career, he volunteered to be a part of Boston University's Traumatic Encephalopathy Program (CTE injuries). Layton Golemon passed away on December 2, 2016.

Chambers Breaks Record

Chambers' record of 27 points set in the 1967-68 season surpassed the old record of 12 points set by Willie Smith during the 1957-58 season.

Percent average. "All the guys on the team helped me out tonight. I have them to thank," said the record-setting guard.

Chambers' first half total equaled his and after producing a 14-point third quarter it was apparent he was going to set a new record.

Thirteen threes in the fourth quarter shattered Brother's record and elicited Chambers' first All-Tivy All-star's record since.

including last night's performance, Chambers is averaging 25.0 points per game, good for a 55 percent shooting average from the floor.

One other Tivy record that many fall to Chambers's year also belongs to Brainerd.

The same season that Brainerd set his 42 game scoring high, he also scored 700 points for the season.

Chambers has 512 points at this point in the season and Tivy has 14 games remaining on their

The sum of Tivy's score points and Holy Cross was 202 points and broke the old record by 10.

The score at the half had Tivy leading 57-0 as the Mustangs' Anthony dominated even without the services of center Robert Wilbourn.

Coach Dan Montgomery, elected to lead Wilbourn, who has been hampered with a sprained ankle while he wrestled Big 8 against Alamo Heights in the Northwest Tournament.

scored almost at will. "We played terrible defense and we made some of those mistakes too," said Coach Montgomery. The tempo of the contest was extremely fast in the second half, and Hasty Cross outscored Trinity 57-41 in the final two periods. By the end of the third quarter the Knights had closed the gap to 76-41 in favor of Trinity. The Knights received most of their offensive punch from Raul Elizondo, Jr. point, and James

Only Overyby, states turned sixth man, handed out 13 assists to tie a record set by Robin Parker during the 1976-77 season. Overyby also had 13 assists in a game last year.

One team record also became obscure.

In the 1971-72 season Tivy defeated Crystal City 14-3 to set a record for most total points by both teams in one game.

The Antlers opened district play against South San West this Friday night in San Antonio and Ethier is confident he can help the team.

"I think I can fit-in in district. There will be a little let down in rebounding but I think I can do a good job on offense," said a confident Ethier after the game. Defense was nonexistent in the second half as both teams

and Eltonardo had it. Jesse Brown, the hero of Tivy's come-from-behind win over Seguin last Saturday night, scored 16 for tivy and had 10 assists.

Gay Benson scored 10 and finished on the boards.

- Other season stats by Jon Chambers:

Jon still holds the most points scored in one season, scoring 866 points in 1978-79; breaking the previously held record of 708 points by Willie Bratcher in the 1967-68 season. Jon averaged 25.4 points in his senior season, and scored 40 points or more on four other occasions that year. The team finished with a 29-4 overall record (second best record of all time in one season).
