This exercise will acquaint you with websites for ClubRunner, The Rotary Club of Tyler, District 5830, and Rotary International. If you are not computer literate, we can work with you another way. Please print this form for your answers.

You are a member of the Rotary Club of Tyler. The Rotary Club of Tyler is a member of Rotary International. Should you transfer to another club, you must be removed from this club's membership roll before another club can accept you on their roll. You can only be an active member of one club at a time, although you may be an honorary member of multiple clubs.

Rotary Club of Tyler dues and contributions are not tax exempt.

Contributions to the Tyler Rotary Foundation and the Rotary Foundation are tax exempt. Tyler Rotary Foundation contributions count towards the Billy E. Hibbs Fellowship award while contributions for the Rotary Foundation count towards the Paul Harris Fellow award.
