

Mark taught himself slight of hand by reading books and watching videos while serving in the United States Navy. Today, he is a world-renowned Slight of Hand Magician and Teacher. He performs globally.

Deb is a Master Seamstress, Master Puppeteer, Professional Face, Body and FX Artist, DJ, KJ and singer. She was also a professional clown for 45 years.

Perfect Occasion Costumes and Magic, located on N. State Street in Middlefield, Ohio, houses 30,000 rental costumes for theater and stage productions, photo shoots for historic places, and community events. Mascot costumes and over 600 types of wigs are also available. Perfect Occasion maintains, mends, cleans, and stores the costumes in their proper areas via a detailed storage system.

Whips Magic Emporium, located on Lake Road East in Geneva-on-the-Lake, Ohio, provides supplies to magicians, and Mark teaches other magicians how to perform. Mark performs close-up magic and treated Warren Rotarians to several card and coin tricks this week. He also teaches pit bosses in casinos different techniques used to catch card sharks.
