

RAY SINCHAK, THE GOLDEN YEARS OF HOLLYWOOD

Ray Sinchak is one of the best story tellers around, and this week, he did not disappoint! He shared a sory about Errol Flynn, an Australian actor who achieved worldwide fame during the Golden Age of Hollywood.

Errol Flynn grew up in Tasmania and discovered at a young age that he was not built for a 9 to 5 job. He wanted adventure and money. Wherever he went, he carried a black doctor's bag that contained a bottle of gin and two glasses. And one of his best friends that he enjoyed



sharing a drink with was President Batista of Cuba. Flynn was a frequent visitor to Cuba during the last years of Batista's regime.

When Fidel Castro overthrew Batista, Errol Flynn was summoned to his office. Flynn was told that he shouldn't come back to Cuba because Castro could not guarantee his safety.

Another tidbit that Ray shared about Errol Flynn took place around the time that Don Juan was filmed. The movie was supposed to be shot in Italy but Flynn went to Mexico instead. There, he wanted to go "where the real people" were – a small town in the desert. While having a drink in the town, Flynn began talking to a girl whose boyfriend did not take kindly to the encounter. A big fight ensued, and everyone, including Flynn, was thrown in jail. Flynn was locked in a cell with the disgruntled boyfriend who gathered his friends and aimed to gang up on Flynn. However, Flynn's life was spared when one of the gang members recognized Flynn as "Captain Blood" and convinced the other men that they couldn't hurt him.

OPENING NIGHT is slated for Sunday, December 31st! This year is exceptionally exciting as Warren celebrates its 225th birthday!! The birthday bash will begin with a Dancing Light Show on Courthouse Square at 6 p.m., and entertainment will follow at 6:15 p.m. in various venues around Downtown Warren. Wristbands are required to enter all of the venues and can be purchased online from now through December 28th by visiting: www.warrenrotary.org/tickets . Everyone who purchases a wristband in advance will be mailed a coupon that will need to be turned in at the Log Cabin directly across from the Courthouse Square Fountain in exchange for a wristband. Wristbands WILL NOT be mailed in advance. Coupons will be mailed out until December 21st. After that, simply go to the Log Cabin the night of the event and give a volunteer your name and you will be given the proper number of tickets as indicated on our master list of guests. After December 28th, when online sales shut down, wristbands will need to be purchased the night of the event at the Log Cabin. Adult wristbands for those 10 years of age and older are \$10. Children, ages 3 through 9 years of age, will pay \$5 per wristband. Children under three are free. Any Warren Rotarians who sell tickets should keep a list of who bought tickets from them and give it to a committee member.

<u>HOSTING DUTIES ON OPENING NIGHT</u>: Warren Rotarians are needed to carry out hosting duties for Opening Night at a variety of venues. They will be responsible for welcoming guests, checking wristbands, and selling wristbands to those who don't already have one. You can request the

SPREADING CHRISTMAS CHEER


