

SCOPE SENIOR SERVICES



Warren Rotarian Mike
Wilson has served as Director
of SCOPE Senior Services
for the past 9 years. He
and his staff graciously
hosted our January 17 th
luncheon meetingat their
Warren center and spoke
with us about the services
they offer to senior citizens
in our community.

Jen, Patty and Sandy, three prospective Rotarians and Board Members of SCOPE's Senior Showcase,

were guests at this weeks meeting. Exactly one year ago, they began the process of planning the great show held at Robin's Theatre earlier this month. Full of amazing entertainment and talent, the Senior S howcase will be an annual event!

SCOPE staff are partnering with Sha ron Grover of Ridgeview Country Tours, LLC, to offer 16 senior-friendly one day trips this year. Participants will be able to experience "historic towns, rolling country sides, shopping, food and exciting cities", according to SCOPE's Senior Citizens Trips and Tours Brochure for 2024.

In addition to offering social outings and activities, SCOPE sponsors many educational and support services to the elderly in the community. For example, they publish a list of certified senior - friendly contractors, insurance agents, home healthcare agencies, and more as a way to help prevent individuals from getting scammed and taken advantage of. They offer a "Grands Program" for grandparents who are raising their grandchildren. The support group, which meets the first and third

Thursday of every month at North Mar Church from 6 to 8 p.m., provides educational information about financial and legal issues and more. Adults are also given the opportunity to mentor five to nine year olds via the Big Brothers, Big S isters program.

Marge Haley, Manager of SCOPE's N. Park Avenue site, provides seniors and individuals on Social Security Disability with Medicare and financial assistance. She helps them secure lower utility rates and prescription assistance, provides financial counseling to widows, and assists with wills and power of attorney forms.



IT Director, Kevin Weber, provides technology, cell phone, and laptop support and training to those in need. This includes education on how to use and repair devices, prevent identity theft, and avoid scams malware, and computer hacking. Kevin's services support anyone in Trumbull County who is 60 years of age or older. He indicated that this is so important because it is common for family members of these individuals to not always be available. Since everyone learns in a different way, Kevin breaks down

information, step-by-step. He can also assist individuals in creating cover letters and resumes, and applying for jobs online. Finally, K evin is able to assist individuals with hearing impairments in accessing apps so they can hear and speak to devices and sync their hearing aides to their phones.

SCOPE Senior Services partners with the AARP Foundation to offer free tax preparation and assistance 40 trained volunteers in Trumbull County are led by local coordinator, Bob Kovach. These services are available five days per week during tax season and one day per week for the remainder of the year for



low to moderately low income individuals and seniors. Bob indicated that their goal is to maximize refunds and take the fear out of taxes.

In addition to these staff members, SCOPE Senior Services has a Veterans Advocate who assists Veterans with relocating, returning to the workforce, etc.

Looking ahead, Mike Wilson reported that American S ign Language classes will be resuming every Monday from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. , beginning on February $8^{\,\text{th}}$.

Following this educational program, Warren Rotarians and guests were able to tour the Riverside Railroad Club's indoor layout which is currently located at the SCOPE Center. The club was established in 2002. They operate G gauge trains which vary in scale, and their current layout has three independent loops which are capable of running several trains at a time. Membership is open to all train enthusiasts, and club dues are \$36 a year.
