In 1984, the building became Southview Manor, a group home for the mentally challenged, which served 147 residents for nearly 40 years. Finally, in December 2021, the Von Isley family (Joshua and Gerna) purchased the estate and transformed it into the event venue that it is today. As Cindy searched for a possible venue for Presidents' Night, she thought the Von Isley was "magical" - a perfect place to celebrate "The Magic of Rotary" that we experienced over the past year.

The evening began with a cocktail hour and music by Mike G. Guests then moved into the dining hall, where table-side entertainment was provided by David Garza and Sergio Castro. A buffet dinner was catered by Ciminero's, and music by a Sax Quartet was provided throughout the meal.
