Well, this past Wednesday was the first full day of spring, even though the weather isn't very warm! But what else is March 20^{th} known for?

- * For those of you who are ready to say goodbye to winter, March 20th was National Snowman Burning Day!
- * It was also International Day of Happiness, a time to find joy in life's little moments and simple pleasures.
- * It was Kiss Your Fiance Day!
- * And we celebrated Fred Rogers with Won't You Be My Neighbor Day.
- * Finally, for all you foodies out there, March 20th was National Ravioli Day & National Macaron Day.

The month of March is set aside to increase awareness of epilepsy, colon cancer, developmental disabilities, multiple sclerosis, nutrition, and yes - umbrellas.

March is also National Women's History Month. Way back in 1848, 300 females and males signed the Declaration of Sentiments as a plea to end discrimination. From that point on, there was at least a 13 decade long battle to end women's suffrage, allow women to vote, provide equal pay to men and women, and end sex discrimination in education. In 1973, we had Row vs. Wade.

As far back as 1916, the first woman was elected to the House of Representatives - Jeanette Rankin. In 1981, Sandra Day O'Connor became the first woman appointed to the Supreme Court. And in 1984, Geraldine Ferraro was the first woman nominated as Vice-President on a majority party ticket.

Five years later, in 1989, a significant moment in women's history centered around Rotary. In that year, the Council on Legislation voted to admit women into Rotary Clubs worldwide. It was Frank Devlyn who



reminded people that Rotary had to adapt to a changing world – a world that was much different from 1905 when Rotary was founded by a group of gentlemen. Mr. Devlyn later went on to become RI President in the year 2000.

That vote followed decades-long efforts of both men and women to allow admission of women into clubs. As far back as 1950, there was an enactment to delete the word "male" from the Rotary Constitution. In the 60s and 70s, several proposals to admit women into Rotary in India, Sri Lanka, and Brazil were dismissed. In 1977, the charter Rotary Club of Duarte, California violated the Rotary Constitution by admitting women as members, and the club's membership in RI was terminated. The Duarte club filed a lawsuit, followed by two appeals. Finally, on May 4, 1987, the Supreme Court ruled that Rotary Clubs could not exclude women from membership based on gender. The club of Marin Sunrise, California became the first club to have women as legal charter members. In 1988, clubs in Canada began to admit women, and in 1989, it became a worldwide movement.

By 1990, there were 20,200 female Rotarians worldwide. Five years later, there were eight female District Governors. In 2005, the first woman was appointed as a trustee of the RI Foundation. And in 2022, Jennifer Jones began her term as the first female President of RI.

This year's theme for National Women's History month is "Women Who Advocate for Equity, Diversity and Inclusion". What a great time to celebrate the women who are active participants in Rotary, serving their communities in increasing numbers, and serving in leadership positions. And this week was even more special, as we inducted three new female members into the Rotary Club of Warren!
