As a child, Ben Kulper enjoyed playing "army and medic". As he entered adulthood, his career spanned both fields and more!

In high school and college, Ben followed a pre-med course of studies. In 1980, he graduated from Autonoma De Guadalajara Facultad De Medicina, and completed his residency in Akron. He served as a Primary Care Internal Medicine physician with Trumbull Mahoning Medical Group for over 37 years, doing rounds at both St. Joseph's Hospital and Trumbull

Memorial.

Following a letter of invitation, in January, 1986, Ben began a long application process to join the Army Reserves. By May 15th of that year, he was sworn into the Army and served at field hospitals in Canton, Ohio, as well as Erie and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He stayed in the Reserves until the age of 60. Ben later got involved in the Civil Air Patrol. He had what he described as "a worthwhile career" doing emergency search and rescue and hyperbaric wound care.

Following his retirement, Ben received the first ever retiree recall due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and went back on active duty in Alaska, where he was stationed for 179 days.

Back in retirement from active duty, Colonel Kulper now spends his days acting as the Rotary Club of Warren's Sgt. of Arms.


