THE ROTARY CLUB OF WARREN WELCOMES DISTRICT GOVERNOR RICHARD TIRPAK

Dr. Rich Tirpak received his Bachelor's Degree in Zoology and his D.V.M. from The Ohio State University. He was employed as a Veterinarian in Canton, Ohio for over 39 years before retiring in 2018.

Rich has served on the Vestry and Finance Committee of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, and on the Board of Directors of both the Stark County Humane Society and Pegasus Farm Equestrian Center.

In 1982, Rich was inducted into the Rotary Club of Canton, and in 1986, he transferred to the Rotary Club of Plain Township. He has been actively involved in various committees and was the President of the Rotary Club of Plain Township from 2016-2017. He currently serves as District Governor of Rotary District 6650.

During his visit with the Rotary Club of Warren this week, the District Governor noted that some clubs, sadly, don't invite him to one of their meetings out of fear of being told how to change. However, he asserted that this is not his purpose, as only the club members can identify problems and make necessary changes. Rather, he was here to tell our club "Thanks" for being Rotarians, being a part of District 6650, and for all that we do.

Rich also shared a few ideas about the 4 C's - Commitment, Continuity, Communication, and Contribution. First, he stated that

Rotarians are committed people of action and ability. He quoted Past DG George Hays, who said that "with ability comes responsibility", and if you are committed, you will always find time for something of value.

Next, Rich talked about how much Rotarians love reinvention of the wheel. We look for new leaders, new ideas, and new goals every year. However, it takes longer than a year for an idea to come to fruition. As a result, he encourages clubs to find leaders early. A Rotary club's President, Vice-President, and President-Elect need to meet often to discuss ideas and plan the future of the club. This type of continuity and communication needs to constantly take place between the officers, the Board, the members and the District. Rich asked our club to please keep the lines of communication open because he can only have a successful year as District Governor if individual clubs have a successful year.

At this point, Rich posed this question, "Do you value and have fun being a Rotarian?" If so, then he urged members to share their passion about Rotary with others. Think outside the box and find, not only new members, but also friends of Rotary. Allow individuals who are new to Rotary to be involved in whatever way they want and they might eventually become longstanding members. Create a welcoming environment.

Finally, whether you are a new member or a seasoned veteran of Rotary, it is important that you contribute. Rich described Rotary as "a fine engine that does good things". Yet, did you know that while 70% of clubs contribute to the Rotary Foundation, only 38% of members do!?

In 1985, Rotarians started an arduous campaign to eradicate a devastating disease – Polio. While we've come close, it's still out there, and it's only an airplane ride away from the United States. Yet, only 12% of club members donate to PolioPlus. Are you willing to sacrifice a cup of coffee a week so that a child doesn't have to use braces in order to walk or so an adult doesn't perish? If so, consider donating \$100 annually to the End Polio Now campaign.

Rich suggested other ways for clubs and members to contribute: do something to help kids, improve mental health, increase membership in Rotary, or sponsor an End Polio Now event. Perform acts of kindness. This makes people more resilient. And only by building peace within can we build peace in the world.

The Rotary Club of Warren would like to thank DG Rich Tirpak for spending time with our members and for his inspiring words of wisdom.

Operation Pollination is an inclusive partnership project that recognizes the importance of restoring, protecting and maintaining pollinator habitats on public and private land. In June of 2020, Rotary International added "supporting the environment" as its 7th Area of Focus. Ohio was the first state in the nation to have all of its District Governors sign a resolution in support of Operation pollination. Furthermore, The Rotary Club of Warren, during Christine Cope's Presidential Year, was the first club in the district to sign a pledge to engage in pollinator habitat restoration. Two pollinator gardens have been planted by our club, one at The Animal Welfare League of Trumbull County and one at Children's Rehabilitation Center.

This week, we were honored to have DG Tirpak take his turn in signing the Operation Pollination resolution during our club meeting.


