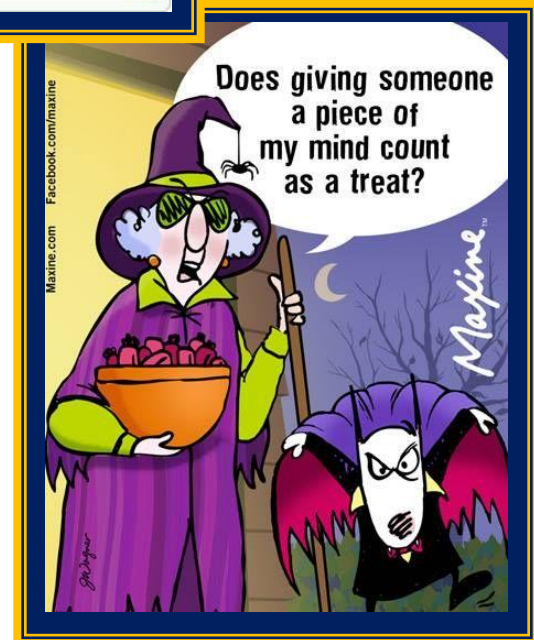
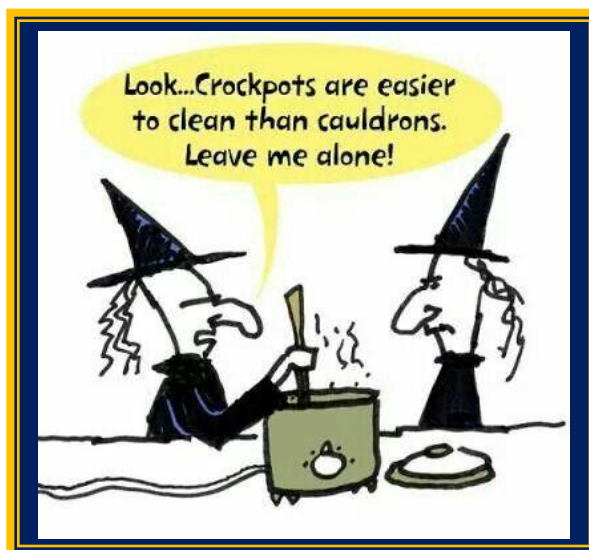

PUBLIC LIBRARY



Sarah Everly has worked for the Warren Trumbull County Public Library (WTCPL) for a little over six years. She earned her Master's Degree in Library and Information Science from Kent State University. She currently serves as the Mobile Library Services Manager. She oversees the Bookmobile and Library by Mail Service, as well as other outreach programs and community events. Everly is passionate about library services and getting out into the community to spread the word about them.

Everly resides in Cortland, and in her spare time, she enjoys adding to her houseplant collection and riding her motorcycle!

The Library by Mail Service is one of the best-kept secrets of the WTCPL. Individuals of any age who have medical conditions or experience physical limitations that prevent them from visiting the library are eligible for this service. All adults 65 and older also qualify. The service provides free shipping of all library materials to your home, including DVDs, audio and print books, and CDs. Individuals may simply borrow the materials for approximately one month and then mail them back to the library in the envelope provided. Book review

magazines are also provided. Materials ship out the day you request them. Approximately 150 people are currently enrolled in this program.

Other online resources that individuals can hook into include: Search Ohio, which provides access to materials available in most locations throughout the county; the free Libby App for audio and e-books; Hoopla, which offers more content than other digital library platforms, including just-released albums, TV shows, and movies; and numerous data bases.

Sarah also spoke about the library's Bookmobile, which is celebrating its 85th anniversary! The Bookmobile spends a lot of time traveling to schools, Amish homes, community events and parades in the Northern part of Trumbull County where others cannot readily access libraries. It made its first trip in 1938 during a huge blizzard! Birthday parties were held for this specialty service this past summer.

In November and December of this year, library patrons can have a family photo taken for free at the WTCPL. A winter extravaganza of family events is being offered in December, as well as programs on genealogy and history.
