

KELLI DENMAN, THE GRAND RESORT



Warren Rotarians had the opportunity to have lunch at and visit The Grand Resort, a premier destination resort right in our back yard! During our visit, Kelli Denman, General Manager of the resort, told us about the amenities available at this hidden gem in Trumbull County.

The Grand Resort has 132 guest rooms and suites, and those enjoying the hotel accommodations have full

access to the services available at Avalon's five locations, including free shuttle service. Guests typically include individuals from Canada, the domestic United States and around the world. In addition to hotel services, the resort offers golf packages and a med spa, and hosts weddings, corporate meetings, and other events.

Three membership packages are offered, resulting in 5500 members currently. Junior Membership and Grandparents Membership packages are also going to be added. Dining includes a wine cellar, The Atrium, Gatsby's Fine Dining, and the outdoor pool patio. There are three different restaurants at each of the other locations.

The resort's success is evident in an increase in occupancy from 53% to 68%, 400 to 500 guests taking advantage of outdoor amenities daily, an increase in their average daily rate by \$25 over last year, and their AAA rating as a three diamond resort. They achieved this rating by updating their guest rooms, purchasing new furniture, and signing with Spectrum to showcase Browns and Steelers games. Kelli indicated that she is confident the resort can become a four diamond destination within

the next year. Plans are in place to upgrade the HVAC system, renovate the elevator so that it can travel to all floors, install illuminating lights, begin communicating with guests via the television, and add accent pillows and other furnishings. An additional goal is to make customer service the best it can be. Kelli is passionate about her staff and offers a lot of employee training. All in all, the resort's success has also helped to increase rates in other local hotels.
