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About Our Club

The Rotary Club of Perrysburg was admitted to Rotary International on June 17, 1979. It now has approximately 110 members who either live or work in the Perrysburg area.

Our club meets at Carranor Hunt and Polo Club every Friday at 11:45am as well as at various social events throughout the year. You may bring a guest to any regular Friday meeting for \$15 to cover the cost of lunch. Prospective members invited by a current Rotarian may come to a meeting at no charge by informing the sergeant-at-arms.

Our club is governed by an eleven-person board of directors that is elected each December and takes office the following July.

Perrysburg Rotary also maintains a 501c3 non-profit corporation called the Perrysburg Rotary Service Foundation. This foundation manages proceeds from our many fundraising activities and distributes grants to many local, regional and international organizations.

Financial Obligations and Attendance Requirements

Financial Obligations:

The annual dues and fees for the 2018-19 Rotary Year are \$500. This amount covers all per capita dues to Rotary International, Rotary District 6600, and Rotary Club of Perrysburg, as well as the costs of the December and June fellowship events (Holiday Party and Charter Night) for the member and a guest.

The cost for attendance at a weekly meeting is \$15 with lunch or \$5 without lunch. Beverage service is included with both weekly options.

Payments

Members may select from two payment options:

- A prepaid option of \$900 per year that includes lunches
or
- \$500 dues payment and payment for meetings attended upon check-in at the weekly Rotary club meeting.

Annual invoices are sent out in May with payment required by June 15. Dues may be paid by credit card or check payable to the Rotary Club of Perrysburg. Per Rotary Club of Perrysburg's Bylaws Article 6, Section 3, dues not paid within 30 days of invoice may be assessed a \$25 late fee. Dues not paid within 45 days of invoice may subject the member to termination.

Weekly meeting fees for those who elect not to use the prepaid option must be paid at the time of check-in by cash, check or credit card.

Other Financial Considerations

Members are asked to become sustaining members of The Rotary Foundation with a tax-deductible gift of \$125 (\$100 to the Annual Fund, \$25 to Polio eradication). The average annual cost of participation in club events like our annual charity auction is \$200. Each week at our regular meetings we offer an optional 50/50 raffle and a chance to participate in \$2 "fines."

Attendance Requirements

The Rotary Club of Perrysburg has established a Credit System in lieu of attendance as a requirement of continued membership. Members whose age plus years of membership in Rotary International exceed 85 are exempt from this requirement provided they have been Rotarians in this or another club for at least 20 years.

Thirty (30) total credits are required of which twelve (12) must include attendance at a regularly scheduled Perrysburg Rotary luncheon meeting.

The following items meet the standard for an engagement credit.

- Any Rotary District 6600 or Rotary International sponsored meeting, event or activity
- Any Perrysburg Rotary sponsored meeting, event or activity, including monthly fellowship events, Annual Holiday Party and Annual Charter Night celebration, club committee/board meeting.
- Club service project
- Perrysburg Rotary Service Foundation Trustees meeting
- Any other Rotary Club's regular meeting, often referred to as a "make-up." Visit <https://my.rotary.org/en/search/club-finder> to look up another club and its meeting time.
