What Rotary should fund

Classes of projects

- 1. "Emergency" grants
 - a. Funds are needed to complete a worthwhile project
 - b. AND No other source of immediate funds
 - c. On a case by case basis (i.e. Catholic Charities)
- 2. Humanitarian grants
 - a. individual (needs to go to Summer camp parent died etc.)
 - b. OR disaster should be a Rotary project or a project known to Rotary
 - i. AND should be associated with one of the main "pushes" of Rotary
 - ii. AND <u>should not</u> be associated with a church or religion related (they have their own sources of funds)
 - c. AND should not fund projects that could be considered hobbies
- 3. Cultural
 - a. Should promote literacy and/or the arts
 - b. AND should benefit a large number of people in an identifiable class (e.g. all 3rd graders, dictionary project)
 - i. OR should encourage participation in an identifiable class that might not otherwise participate (Leonardo Awards)
 - c. OR will appear to raise the status of the arts in Littleton (Wilderness House)
- 4. Scholarships
 - a. Littleton Scholarship Trust (blind donation)
 - b. Al McConnel Scholarship (Semi-blind must be a RYLA graduate)
- 5. Project oriented (like Eagle Scout projects)
 - a. Should be within Littleton or in surrounding community
 - b. OR in partnership with other clubs and RI
 - c. AND Should be a one time payment
 - d. AND full payment on completion of project or after a full list of requirements have been presented
 - e. AND no continuing funding required
- 6. Continuing Grants
 - a. demonstrated continuing need (i.e. Loaves & Fishes)
 - b. AND goal in alignment with the goals of Rotary (literacy, water etc)
 - c. AND should be local in scope
