12 were present for our first Board Meeting of the Rotary year. We met in the MBCC Board Room. President Nora Pou opened the meeting outlining the Club's Goals and expected outcomes. She introduced Justin Provencher from Hudson Rotary who presented "Making a Splash: Using Social Media to Promote Rotary and Club's Programs/ *Events*". He gave ideas for getting the "most bang for the buck" out of social media. This included creating a "brand"; sharing messages; recruitment; attracting volunteers and making "daily connections" He encouraged adding pictures and videos to make the approach relevant, memorable and shareable...a sort of "sneak peek of the future". He said it is important to keep the media up-to-date. Also use graphic design to push the human factor. Above all "have fun with it". It's an opportunity to "raise our sights". A unanimous vote was taken in favor of the <u>Food Insecurity Budget</u> and the <u>General Funds Budget</u>.

Andrea Kaiser and Patrick Hayden will serve as cochairs of the Club Fundraising this year. Linda Tighe will be the Club's Sergeant-at-Arms.

Susan Bevilacqua (Director of Service Projects) presented her planned Service Projects for 2024-2025 including current & possible new projects; possible organizations to partner with, and possible Rotaract and

RYLA activities. She will be joined by Donna Armentano, Vin Spoto, Carl Nelson, Paul Wilson, Joe Roberts, Mishawn Davis, Julie Ginn and Prez Nora Pou. Don McCauley (<u>Director of Public Image</u>) had no report to make at this time. He will be joined by John Adams, Linda Tighe, Bill Westerman, Tory DeFazio, and Patrick Hayden.

Vin rounded up some volunteers for serving a meal on July 23rd at the NECHV. This is in addition to a similar event on August 27th.

Our next meeting (<u>Tuesday, July 23rd</u>) will be a joint meeting with Brookline Rotary in the Library at MBCC. Approximately 50 are expected for a visit by our District Governor. Nora would like help to set up.

The next Board meeting is <u>Tuesday</u>, July 30th via Zoom.

<u>What can a donation to</u> <u>The Rotary Foundation do?</u>

- **Provide clean water.** Rotary clubs in Cambodia and Taiwan collaborated to obtain and install water purification equipment for floating towns on Tonie Sap, the largest freshwater lake in Southeast Asia.
- **Prevent and treat disease.** Rotary clubs around the world strengthen communities by keeping them healthy. Clubs in the U.S. states of Wisconsin and Minnesota obtained a mobile clinic that provides free services for people without health insurance. In Korea, Rotary clubs assist cyclists who have partial or complete vision loss.
- **Grow local economies.** Women in Uganda who lifted their families out of poverty, with support from microloans, started a Rotary club dedicated to empowering other entrepreneurs.
- **Protect the environment**. A global grant scholarship allowed **Gabi Fleury** to study conservation biology and become an "interspecies diplomat" who helps communities find creative solutions to the conflicts between humans and wildlife that are becoming more common.
- Encourage education. The Guatemala Literacy Project has worked for decades to improve literacy rates and keep children in school.
