Mood disorders are the #1 cause of disabilities. Over 300 million are affected by depression. Annually, over 800,000 die by suicide! To heighten awareness Bob began through Wellesley High School, establishing an Rotary Interact Club determined to involve peer leadership to prevent depression. It spread to Puerto Rico, India and recently Nigeria in six years. He showed us a manual put together by Boston Children's Hospital, Break Free from Depression— Curriculum for Grades 9-12. Much of its success was achieved with the help of Rotary Global Grants. "What's improved?" showed the outcome by country broken down by knowledge / help-seeking confidence / attitude. He is trying go pass on and promote the experience of the last six year so the project continues. He showed an example of student video communication between Wellesley and India. "What action can I take today?" Signing up / taking the online train-the-trainer/ and join the Mental Health Initiative (RAG). There was interesting discussion and efforts to continue to advance the project. We hope for future success!

President Bill concluded the meeting mentioning the need for volunteers in the Middle School's Food Recovery & Compost Program; the Wellesley Conservation Council's dedication of the bridge over the vernal pool (9/7/19) in Wellesley, and upcoming Repair Café (#6) on October 5th.
