DeFazio. Our guest speakers, Doug and Jill presented the "how" and "why" of developing soft ball fields for girls on the Lee & Hunnewell Fields on Washington St. For two years they have been working on this project and are very knowledgeable. Their presentation included: Who uses the land; current conditions including drainage, access, and seating, etc. They compared to the stunning Little League's Reidy Field at the end of the Hunnewell Park. They gave the project's history from 2013 on as they outlined their goal to raise \$ 1.3 million to renovate the fields. They showed conceptual designs for both fields including all the amenities. One field will be named for **Diane** Warren, late co-founder and commissioner of the Wellesley Girls Softball League. They were pleased to announce that improvements will begin on the Lee Field soon and on the other field in 2020. The Fields will be administered by the Wellesley DPW. Disaster response grants...

On April 1st, The Rotary Foundation introduced a new type of grant: *Rotary disaster response grants*. These grants, funded by contributions to the Rotary Disaster Response Fund, support relief and recovery efforts in areas affected by disaster. Qualified districts in the affected area or country may apply for a maximum grant of \$25,000, pending availability of funds. They may apply for additional grants after they report on any previous disaster response grants. To apply the district governor and district rotary Foundation chair complete the *Rotary Disaster Response Grant Application* and send it to grants@rotary.org.
