21 Rotarians and guests gathered for the opening meeting of the 2018 new Rotary year. **VP Bill Westerman** opened the meeting with table introductions. After the Pledge, **Toby Kell** gave the Invocation. We were happy to see **Paul Falcone** who recorded the meeting for *Wellesley Media*. **Fred Wright** gave a plug for the 2018 RYLA. **Tory DeFazio** reminded Rotarians about the ongoing EREY (*see right*).

*Happy Dollars* came from **Tobin, Adams, Wright, Rowbotham & DeFazio**. Bill described some of the Wellesley Rotary projects including Arbor Day and the recent Repair Café for our guests.

Our speaker **Michael Tobin** from the Wellesley Conservation Council was introduced. Founded in 1958 the WCC is a private non-profit organization working with the public Natural Resources Commission and other entities concerning open space in the town of Wellesley. They own and operate approximately 45 acres of natural lands and areas with restrictions. He outlined the many program and educational activities of the WCC. He presented some “old favorites” (Clean-up Days, Bird Walks, etc.) and “new programs” (Eco-camp for 15 Middle School kids, implementing Land Trust Alliance standards, etc.). Highlighted of his presentation were several aerial videos (Pickle Point & Guemsey Sanctuary) and the Cronks Rocky Woodland on Crown Ridge Road. There is interest in collaborating with Wellesley Rotary on future projects and a dialogue will begin. Q&A included membership in WCC (\$35 per year) and future plans. ▲▲▲

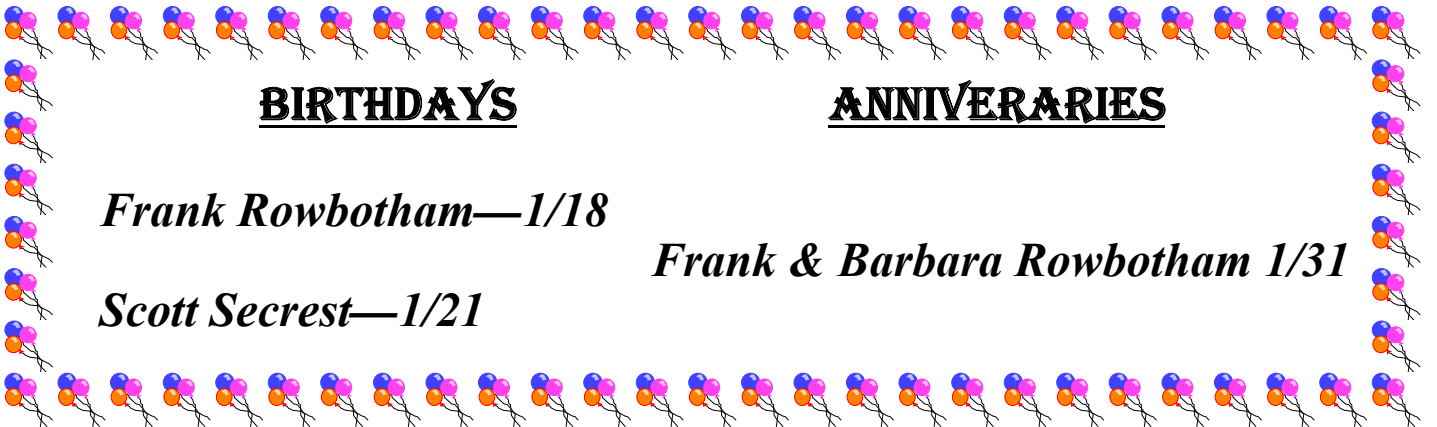
