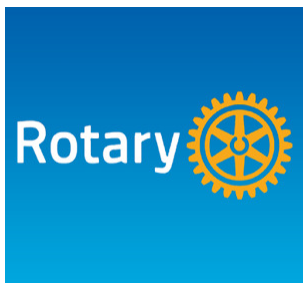

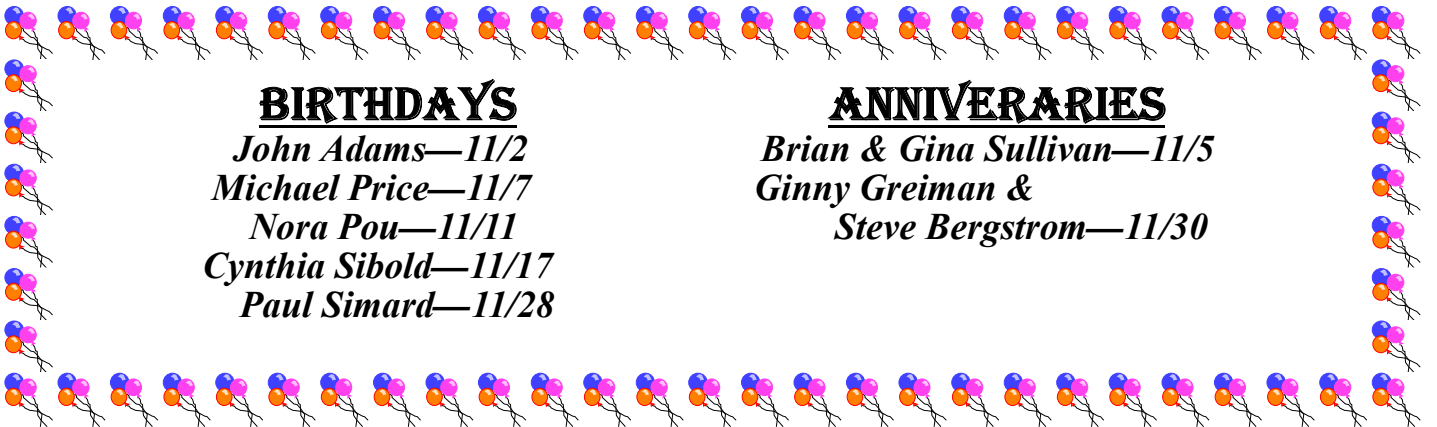
reminder about the Football Banquet (see related).
