continued... on-going Food Insecurity project at MassBay. Susan Bevilacqua mentioned an upcoming meeting by the High School Interact Club on the "break-free from depression" efforts. Vin Spoto gave an opioid crisis update including plans for a multi-generational meeting. John Adams added a future presentation on peer recognition of addiction. **Donna Armentano** graciously agreed to head the 4-Way Test Essay contest at the Middle School this year. Sponsorship and support by teachers is critical. Regarding Arbor Day plans (April), John Adams is hoping to enlist participation of Rotaract at Mass Bay. He also mentioned the successful Repair Café's where there are now 15 coaches. The Town gets credit dollars for the project. He also discussed upcoming programs (Historical Society & COA including others). There was consensus to support Camp for Kids again this year.
