At the <u>Board Meeting</u> on **Tuesday**, **July 7th** President Vin covered a number of topics affecting his year at President...

- Financials ably presented by Treasurer, John Adams
- Meeting formats for the year: Online for Speakers? / Traditional for Service? ...to be evaluated monthly
- Yearly calendar
- Members to host meetings (topics & assignments)
- Making Service Meetings more interesting (projects? Committees? Rotary "focus"?, etc.)
- Encouraging Member participation
- Public relations (ideas to involve members and the community)
- Dues for the 2020-2021 will remain the same (\$350) for the year.

Vin announced that Rotary International has added another Goal: Supporting our Environment. (The other six are: Peace & Conflict Resolution; Disease Prevention and Treatment; Clean Water and Sanitation; Maternal and Child Health; Basic Education and Literacy, and Economic and Community Development.)

Wellesley will be included with other District Rotary clubs (Newton, Framingham, Westborough, Concord, Bedford & Billerica) who have done positive things during the pandemic crisis. Our first meeting of the year was held via Zoom on Tuesday, July 7th. The one hour included 21 Rotarians & guests looking in and participating. After the Pledge and an Invocation by Toby Kell we had Happy Dollars from: Rowbotham, Ginn, Westerman, Spoto, Shellito & DeFazio. President Vin announce that 500 facemasks have been given to MassBay; \$30K for front line workers (see Wellesley Rotary Taste of Wellesley Restaurant Plan on p. 2), and 250 face shields for retailers uptown. He then introduced State Representative Alice Peisch who gave us an overview of the last few months on Legislative activity since Governor Baker called a State of Emergency in March. According to Peisch, the Legislature "rose to the challenge" to appropriate \$ 15 million despite "virtual" hearings and "remote sessions. The reopening has been... ...continued

"slow and cautious." Revenues have been difficult to figure out but it is expected there will be a 6-8 billion dollar deficit (The State budget for 2020 was \$43.3 billion). Public transportation has been heatedly discussed and offers challenges in the future. There was discussion about State aid to Special Education.

Many interesting Q&A's included: the prospect of "virtual" changes remaining in the future for families and workers; hoping for help from the Federal Government; the possibility of a "special tax" to help defray the enormous expenses incurred, as well as possible "limited borrowing"; the priority of education remaining high with the advent of on-line learning; looking at the positive side of the pandemic including "productivity", "generosity", "improved technology" and "resourcefulness"; Legislative involvement in police reform including policy, unions, and militarization of the police force in the State.

Our thanks to Representative Peisch, noting she has been our popular Representative since 2002!
