At our Regular meeting on Tuesday, August 4th, 15 members and guests were present. DG Diana Nestorova was introduced by Tory DeFazio. In her remarks addressed to the Club she laid out her vision for D7910 during her year as District Governor especially at this time for increased social justice in the midst of a pandemic. "This is the time to inspire Rotarians. We are a 'people of action'!". She reflected on coming from Bulgaria where there was no difference of opinion allowed, to the United States, where 'service to others' reaches out economically, socially and politically. Citing Rotary's 2020-20121 motto, "Rotary Opens Opportunities" she encouraged leadership by all Rotarians. Diana outlined her priorities for D7910, including: working closely with all Rotarians; increasing membership; working towards club extension, and getting things done now with young people. In this regard she is planning a Youth Forum in August, by bringing youth and Rotarians together. She also talked about The Rotary Foundation and its impact on the international scene. Eradicating polio has been a chief goal. She knows she can rely on Wellesley Rotary for support. On August 12th she is initiating "Open Doors", a monthly Q&A session to discuss topics of interest about Rotary. During her Q&A time, members expressed appreciation and enthusiasm for her presence and message. We were also glad to connect with Rotarian Bob Antho**nv** who joined us from Boston. He gave us an interesting update on the Adolescent Wellness project especially the results from the Rotary Global Grant to Nigeria. Thank you Bob!

Important changes in Global Grants from The Rotary Foundation by K.R. Ravindran, Chair.

It would be an understatement to say the world is facing a global crisis of a magnitude never seen before by this generation. Many of our communities lack funding and are struggling to provide the very services and qualities that would otherwise have made life comfortable. Many of our own members have been seriously affected, both in terms of their health and in terms of their finances.

In these circumstances, The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees must make decisions that enable our organization to persevere and thrive.

We cannot do that without your complete help, support, and understanding. Thus, I have some important updates to share with you about the global grant program.

The global grant program of our Foundation has been an enormous success. In 2013-14, when global grants were introduced, the Foundation awarded 868 global grants worth \$47.3 million.

By 2018-19, the number of global grants awarded has risen to 1.403 worth \$86.6 million. You will note that while demand.... ... to be continued....
