John Adams; 90,000 facemasks will be distributed by District Rotary clubs including Wellesley; pet contest fundraiser being coordinated by **Patrick** Hayden and Andrea Kaiser with committee; District talk on how to improve Club membership on September 16th at 5:30 PM....and much more! Donna then introduced Dr. Drew who gave a fascinating and informative talk about the COVID Symptoms Study he has been involved in. Described as a "real-time scientific, systematic, and data-driven study to fight a pandemic", he defined COVID-19, mapped the "hot spots", and described the disease's severity. His advice?- BE VIGILANT! He outlined the need for more testing, more PPE (personal protective equipment), better contact tracing, mask mandates, and social distancing. We have to survive until an approved vaccine. He and his associates have developed a mobile phone app (go to covid.joinzoe.com) for real time daily information. About 4 million "citizen scientists" are using the app and it has become a big team effort! Robust, adaptable data is captured from the workflow daily, creating a baseline by repeating questions. This information will be "scored" and eventually lead to "predictability" to help identify possible cases and "hot spots" in real time. He encouraged us to become "citizen scientists", to daily log in, and record "how you feel". This will help high-risk groups such as healthcare workers, the elderly, first responders and others. Many interesting O&A's followed. Our thanks to Donna & Dr. Drew!

Important changes in Global Grants from The Rotary Foundation by K.R. Ravindran, Chair.

Continued... This means that applications can use a combination of District Designated Funds (DDF), cash, and/or directed gifts and endowment earnings to fund a global grant. The Foundation will provide a 100 percent World Fund match for all DDF contributions. We hope this new policy will make it easier for applicants to put together financing for a global grant since they are not constrained by the necessity of securing at least \$15,000 in DDF to receive \$ 15,000 in World Fund.

For example, under the new policy, grant financing might look like this: \$10,000 DDF + \$10,000 World Fund + 10,000 cash contributions = \$30,000 global grant Alternative financing when it's needed. Should we again find ourselves in the situation where demand exceeds World Fund supply, we encourage grant sponsors to finance their global grants without a World Fund match.

This means that sponsors can use DDF, cash, directed gifts, or endowment earnings to make up the minimum \$30,000 budget that they need for their grant activity. While everyone would understandably prefer to receive a World Fund match, this proposal allows those with DDF to be able to look for alternative sources of funding......to be continued
