- Amy Letteney gave an update on the Mass Bay Foundation to help returning students pay off their previous balances. <u>See p. 1- bottom left.</u>

- An anonymous donor has pledge <u>\$ 5,000</u> to be matched by Rotarians. The \$10K will help with ongoing WRC projects. Contact **Tory DeFazio** for details.

- Andrea Kaiser gave an update on the pet contest fundraiser. Another meeting next Monday is planned.

- WRC Board approved applying for a Global Grant in support of Bob Anthony's "Break Free From Depression" program in India. Malini Prabhu will head. Prez Vin concluded with comments about the success of making the world polio-free thanks to Rotary. John Adams introduced guest speaker Julian Hill who spoke from his home in East Hartford, Connecticut.. He gave a very inspirational talk about his growing up and confronting challenges not usually experienced by others. In a deeply personal and engaging presentation, he spoke from the heart, rising to end the demons he faced. "Victory is won with many advisors" he counselled. His spirit wasn't broken he found out he had life with new opportunities and purpose. Today he helps others by sharing his experiences. His advice was to have faith in yourself. Don't wallow in the circumstance but search for progress! Develop a love of self and self esteem. "Yes, I am a victor and not a victim."

Important changes in Global Grants from The Rotary Foundation by K.R. Ravindran, Chair.

Conclude... This means that sponsors can use DDF, cash, directed gifts, or endowment earnings to make up the minimum \$30,000 budget that they need for their grant activity. While everyone would understandably prefer to receive a World Fund match, this proposal allows those with DDF to be able to look for alternative sources of funding and still access DDF for global grant activity, even if no World Fund is available. Of course, all of the usual global grant eligibility criteria would still apply to these grants. Global grants are the Foundation's premiere and flagship grant activity, so the quality standards for these activities will never be compromised.

In conclusion, let me again draw your attention to the challenging times we had been presented with—not that you needed to be reminded. It would be appropriate then to commend to you the words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.: "The ultimate measure of a person is not where they stand at times of comfort and convenience, but where they stand at times of challenge and controversy."

I pray that you will be well and you will be safe, my friends. We have an interesting year ahead of us. But we will endure.
