**Nora Pou** conducted the meeting with 18 attending. We opened with the Pledge, and an Invocation by Toby Kell. Happy Dollars: Rowbotham, Spoto, Bevilacqua, Adams, Westerman and Armentano. Nora has been working with MassBay on a food insecurity fundraiser. - https://food -insecurity-at-massbay-fundraiser.square.site/ She prepared a program in collaboration with the National Pork Board Speakers Bureau represented by Adrianne Parr who introduced Lori Stevermer of Trails End Farm in Easton, Minnesota. It was easy for Lori to convey her message via Zoom than to travel to Wellesley! Lori and her husband, Dale, run a family owned pig farm. As a spokesperson she highly supports protecting our food supply and our planet (www.mnpork.com). She described the process of raising pigs for market as part of her "Farm to Fork" diagram. Minnesota produces 16.4 million pigs a year and is 4th in corn production and 3rd in soybean which help feed pigs. Pigs and crops are a great combination and she went on to describe the technology in planning. She gave the "Day in the life of the Pig" and described the important daily observations. Pork processing and markets (retail, food service and exports—30%) along with concerns (sustainability, improvements and impact of pig farmers) rounded off her talk. She gave some tips on preparing pork for eating (lean is ...continued

better so don't overcook!). She concluded advising us that Minnesota pig farmers adapt to change; utilize technology; maintain animal welfare as #1 priority, and keep sustainability as a model of pork production. Many interesting Q& A's followed on such subjects as animal rights, confinement of pigs, types of pigs, and technology. Nora returned to the Food and Insecurity issue citing working with local restaurants, working on a flyer to insert with food deliveries and donations. Volunteers are needed so please contact Nora for more information.

President Vin concluded the program with recognizing recent charity contributions: World of Wellesley (\$250); Friendly Aid Society (\$500); Kids Backing Kids (\$250). He reviewed the upcoming Rotary calendar and encouraged Rotarians to get out and support the Wellesley Got Pets Photo & Video contest (see p. 1).

Background: Help a Mass Bay student balance their income! If a student carries a tuition balance (usually about \$700 or less) at the end of the semester, he/she cannot enroll for the next semester. Last Fall Wellesley Rotary succeeded in getting a District 7910 Grant (as one of Rotary's goals: "Basic Education & Literacy"). With matching funds & generous donors MassBay was able to offer \$ 12,000 to help current students. Now, due to the lingering pandemic there is more stress on students to continue their education. Mass Bay Community College's Mass Bay Foundation helps students bridge this possible gap. Under the "Account Balance Scholarship Program" MassBay ensures the students will be eligible by: -having an existing balance of zero by the end of the previous semester; -has completed 2 semesters at MBCC; -has completed 75% of classes, and, -=has maintained a 2.5 GPA. The Account Balance Scholarship awards are noted on a student's account as 'Pending", which allows the student to register for spring classes, however, the funds are not disbursed until the last Add/Drop date has passed. We are grateful for a new matching grant of \$5,000 for the Spring semester. By contributing to this matching opportunity you can help wipe out an obstacle that prevents a student from enrolling.
