followed by an Invocation by **Toby Kell**. *Happy* Dollars: Rowbotham/ Simard/Spoto/Wright/ AG Sue Peghiny Armentano and Long. Next we heard updates on Projects: "BASP"-Tory DeFazio; Wellesley Got Pets (see attached flier with date extended); Food Insecurity-Dede Long (250 awareness fliers handed out to 14 Wellesley restaurants to be delivered with meals); Nora Pou with updates on food insecurity at MBCC— working with needy students providing delivery to their home. It's been a great success but there is a need for more volunteers. Donna Armantano gave a report on the possibility of building a Community Center in India with the help of a Global Grant. It's a slow process and a Rotary club in India is needed to balance the proposal. A plan to raise & spend requires more discussion. Next, a program on *diversity*, *equity and inclusion* at MBCC is under review. More coming on this. Finally, the first meeting in January will be devoted to implementing the Visioning proposals presented at the December 1st meeting.

Vin introduced former Rotarian and great friend, **Don Khoury**, who agreed to present again his wonderful program on how one gets elected in the U.S. Coming on the conclusion of the recent election Don has tested many times his algorithm determining the success of the candidates. It has a lot to do with 1) <u>Appearances</u> (watch the color and design of that necktie!); 2) <u>Environment</u> (staging, sound, seating...are they commanding?, or cooperating?); and, 3) <u>Body Language</u> (handshake, "touching", and gender differences. Don outlined his recognition of *credibility*, *confidence*, *certainty* and *organization*. Look for signs of deceit! Who's uncomfortable? It was an enjoyable holiday treat. Thanks Don! mark memo "BASP" and get it to Tory DeFazio ASAP. Background: Help a Mass Bay student balance their income! If a student carries a tuition balance (usually about \$700 or less) at the end of the semester, he/she cannot enroll for the next semester. Last Fall Wellesley Rotary succeeded in getting a District 7910 Grant (as one of Rotary's goals: "Basic Education & Literacy"). With matching funds & generous donors MassBay was able to offer \$ 12,000 to help current students. Now, due to the lingering pandemic there is more stress on students to continue their education. Mass Bay Community College's Mass Bay Foundation helps students bridge this possible gap. Under the "Account Balance Scholarship Program" MassBay ensures the students will be eligible by: -having an existing balance of zero by the end of the previous semester; -has completed 2 semesters at MBCC; -has completed 75% of classes, and, -=has maintained a 2.5 GPA. The Account Balance Scholarship awards are noted on a student's account as 'Pending", which allows the student to register for spring classes, however, the funds are not disbursed until the last Add/Drop date has passed. We are grateful for a new matching grant of \$ 5,000 for the Spring semester. By contributing to this matching opportunity you can help wipe out an obstacle that prevents a student from enrolling.
