Due to the coronavirus pandemic our annual Arbor Day tree bagging event scheduled for Tuesday, April 21st has been **cancelled**. Future meetings are on hold. Also, you may know the Club's major fundraiser, Taste of Wellesley, originally scheduled for April, and then moved to September, has been cancelled for 2020. Instead, a new fundraiser for those restaurants that supported the *Taste of Wellesley* has been established! Over the past three years participating restaurants \$78,000 for our Club Foundation. It is time to help them in this crisis. Wellesley Rotary plans to raise **\$200,000** and help by giving them \$12,000 in exchange for 600 meals to be delivered to workers at local hospitals. This also helps support the restaurants and their suppliers. Each restaurant will be responsible for making 200 meals a week over the course of three weeks and deliver them to area hospitals. We are now promoting this fundraiser on websites and social media outlets to help us reach our goal. We are reaching out to individuals as well as the corporate level. A couple driving by slows down to watch the performance. "Wow," the driver says to his wife, "I'm glad I quit drinking. Look at the test they're giving now!"

We are coming together to face a new test of our collective strength during the <u>COVID-19</u> pandemic. Rotary districts around the world are applying for <u>Rotary's disaster response grants</u> in record numbers to empower Rotarians who are actively finding solutions and making a difference in their local communities. But we need your help.

Because of this global need, The Rotary Foundation Trustees have <u>increased</u> the amount available for these grants from \$1 million to \$3 million. That's in addition to the generous contributions from donors to our disaster response fund over the last week. The outpouring of support is inspiring, but the demand will continue to grow, and we currently do not have enough funds to support the substantial amount of grant applications we are currently receiving from districts around the world. Your donation will help keep funds available as even more needs arise.

These grants are already making an impact. They are supplying hospitals in Belgium, Croatia, and Italy with lifesaving ventilators. They're equipping frontline health care workers in Korea, Nigeria, the Philippines, Spain, and the United States with desperately needed personal protective equipment so they can care for patients safely. In India, disaster response grants are also improving conditions for patients and caregivers by bringing disinfectant sprayers, beds, and mattresses to health care facilities.

No challenge is so big that we can't make a difference. As we unite in response to urgent and emerging community needs, we will keep working to fight the spread of this virus and save lives.
