who suffered a fall, Paul Simard who is recovering, and Andrea Kaiser who has a personal injury. Vin updated us on a lot of successful fundraisers: \$ 33K for meals for frontline workers; \$ 14.6K for BASP (see p.1); \$ 6K for the Food Insecurity at MBCC, and \$1K from the Pet Contest. It was interesting to all that the total raised exceeds what we would have raised from the Taste of Wellesley now cancelled for the 2nd year! He also announced that 2K more masks are available from the District. Dede Long reported on reaching out to Wellesley restaurants by passing out 5K fliers about the Food Insecurity program. Andrea Kaiser updated us on the Pet Contest. Online voting for the 14 candidates begins on January 8th and ends on January 24th. The judges results will be announced on February 1, 2021. (See attached flier for complete info.) John Adams then reported on the 2021Visioning Results for the rest of the meeting. He covered in summary slides the areas of interest: Club Services—Membership; Club Services–Public Image & Awareness; Club Administration—Fund Raising; Club Administration-Meetings & Events; Community Service; The Rotary Foundation; Youth-Vocational Services, **Environmental Services & International Services.** Many ideas and interesting discussion followed including polling those present for their top three interests. A survey result will be published to include all members. Some of the ideas presented included: each member take a monthly program; establish a "Friends of Wellesley Rotary" for those unable to become members; build programs of interest & variety to draw in potential members, and keep Rotary in front by approaching and engaging all. John expects the Visioning Plan for the next two years be available in April or May 2021. ♥

### **Rotary and its GPEI\* partners cele**brate a monumental achievement, say global eradication of wild polio is possible with the continued dedication and persistence of Rotarians

\*The GPEI is a public-private partnership led by national governments with six core partners - the World Health Organization (WHO), Rotary International, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), UNICEF, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and, most recently, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.

The World Health Organization (WHO) on 25 August 2020 announced that transmission of the wild poliovirus has officially been stopped in all 47 countries of its African region. This is a historic and vital step toward global eradication of polio, which is Rotary's top priority.

After decades of hard won gains in the region, Rotary and its partners in the GPEI are proclaiming the milestone an achievement in public health. They offer it as proof that strong commitment, coordination, and perseverance can rid the world of polio.

The certification that the African region is free of wild poliovirus comes after the independent Africa Regional Certification Commission (ARCC) conducted thorough field verification... ...continued
