Visit the District website (rotary7910.org) On June 30th Wellesley Rotary made an on-line donation of **\$600** to **Rotary's Polio Fund**. This will be matched by D7910 (District Designated Funds) 7.5X. Congratulations to all the "Happy" ones who participated.

The annual *Every Rotarian Every Year* campaign has ended. On June 26th contributions of \$5,000 (from 10 Rotarians and one former Rotarian) plus \$2,000 matching, for a total of **\$7,000**, was sent to <u>The Rotary Foun-</u> <u>dation</u>. Our thanks to all who participated.

and a moment of Silence we had *Happy Dollars* from Adams, Spoto (2), Rowbotham, Kaiser (2), Westerman, Tighe, Torres, Arthur and Pou. **John Adams** reviewed the approved Budget for 2021 -2022. Linda then discussed a possible fundraiser in the Fall—a Raffle which could raise a possible \$30K. Tickets could sell for \$20 and the fundraiser last for 6 weeks during September & October. Andrea Kaiser and Paul Simard agreed to be Co-Chairs and are forming an active committee. Questions remain concerning sponsorship, State permit, publicity among other items. It received an enthusiastic response. Our annual fundraiser, Taste of Wellesley, is tentatively scheduled for May 12, 2022 at Elm Bank. Upcoming meetings will have speakers at the 2nd meeting. The next meeting will include a report from the Ad Hoc By-Law Committee headed by PP Bill Westerman which has concluded updating the Club's 2015 draft. **PP Frank Rowbotham** has reviewed. <u>A 2 /3rd's Club vote is needed for approv-</u> al. The Committee also included: **Past President Vin** Spoto, President Linda Tighe, Donna Armentano and PP Tory DeFazio.
