Tickets (\$20 each) will be sold for gift cards leading to a big drawing in November. A design for the ticket is coming. She reminded the membership to sell tickets in person as well as on-line. Before introducing our guest speaker, Dr. Marybeth Martello, John Adams filled us in on Rotary's efforts to promote environmental action both at the District 7910 level (see calendar) and locally. Repair Cafés, Bagging trees (April), and the Police Station garden are all examples. Dr. Martello presented us with Wellesley's Climate Action Plan as an opportunity to build a better future She outlined Wellesley's greenhouse emissions as coming from waste (1%), transportation (43%) and buildings (56%). She then gave us a "roadmap" of actions to take in order to reach our goals. The "pathways" included energy, buildings, mobility, natural resources, waste, and governance. There are different levels of each involving public education, volunteering and changing bylaws. She covered engagement by the "stakeholders" and a proposed timeline. There were many interesting Q&A's as a follow-up to a timely meeting.

Prez Linda called a Board Meeting at the close of our regular meeting. Discussion centered around the fundraising raffle. John Adams will obtain the permit on September 8th. Design ideas, publicity and timeline were reviewed. The winners will be announced in November. There was also discussion about selling tickets during the *Wonderful Wellesley Weekend* (October 2nd & 3rd) including presence in the Veterans' Parade.
