The Mass. Cultural Council was formed in 1990 and now has expanded to 329 local councils in the Commonwealth. Wellesley receives only \$7,000 because of its high real estate value and income. She reviewed the application process, training of members, and the process of surveys. New and creative programs are encouraged especially original ones, to enrich the culture and quality of life in Wellesley. Nora feels there is a lot in common between WCC and WRC and is looking for ways to partner. Andrea suggested a collaboration and will make application. **Patrick Hayden** offered to help with his music connections across the spectrum. Nora commented she is hoping for “doing some exciting stuff”, perhaps in the way of public art as well. Other ideas were discussed (collaborating with the Library, and other Cultural Councils).
