

Back in the early fall of 2020, a group of Wellesley Rotarians began brainstorming fundraising and fundraising ideas to help support our Rotary Club's projects. The idea that received the most support was a **Pet Photo Contest** that could be conducted virtually in November and December. Rotary and its GPEI* partners celebrate a monumental achievement, say global eradication of wild polio is possible with the continued dedication and persistence of Rotarians

* The **GPEI** is a public-private **partnership** led by national governments with six core **partners** – the World Health Organization (WHO), Rotary International, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), UNICEF, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and, most recently, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.

Now that the African region is free of wild poliovirus, five of WHO's six regions, representing more than 90 percent of the world's population, are now free of the disease. Polio caused by the wild virus is still endemic in Afghanistan and Pakistan, in the WHO's Eastern Mediterranean region. The African region's wild polio-free certification was celebrated during a livestream event. Speakers included Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari, **Bill Gates**, Rotary International President Holger Knaack, Nigeria PolioPlus chair Dr. Tunji Fun**sho**, and representatives of other GPEI partners. The celebration was followed by a press conference. In the program, Knaack spoke about people needing good news during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. "The challenges ahead are formidable," Knaack said, "That's why we must recognize this great achievement and commend all the people who played important roles in reaching this milestone.
