Food Insecurity Forum—with *Kids Backing Kids* is scheduled for **March 2** (Hosted by **Nora Pou & Prez Vin Spoto**).. We are planning to ask other organizations who have a food insecurity program to join us in a <u>Food Insecurity Forum</u> to see how we might join efforts.

At our February 16th meeting we were joined by 23 participants including many from MassBay Community College. We welcomed DG Diana Nestorova who was interested in the topic for District consumption, also PDG Ralph Hammond from the Bedford Rotary Club. President Vin opened the meeting with the Pledge followed by an Invocation by **Toby** Kell. Our guest speaker was Lisa MacDonald, Director of Equity Compliance at MassBay, introduced by Julie Ginn. Lisa plunged us right into a subject of high interest today, how to deal with situations including conversations about race. She outlined how equity and inclusion works.... sometimes very difficult. It involves a shared experience requiring respect. She posed several questions including ,why do we consider it important? And, where do we begin? She suggested the year 1619 when slavery was allowed in the colonies. Where are we in our outlook? How was race thought about when we where young? And, how did this shape us as a young person? Another question focused on some key events of the last year when attitudes evolved. Here, it has brought more ...continued

awareness on the race subject despite much denial. Her final question was opening our thoughts about race, how much easier it is to converse about it. Its good and healthy. She posed several FAQ's: "So What can I do?" (conduct an honest introspection, see people for who they are, "Are we really all in the same boat?"); "Challenge: name this space!" (Is it safer?, "white" space?, bring out attention.) So what else can I do? (use inclusive language, be respectful, define words and terminology). She concluded giving us her list of recommended readings and encouraged us to reflect (What are you consuming?, dinner table conversations, when to speak up, what to say, risk of speaking up, and, practicing "self care" - like take a breath, know your self limits, and when to step away). Our thanks to Lisa & Julie for a timely program: In other Club matters: *Happy Dollars*: Ginn, DeFazio, Adams, Spoto & Kaiser. Vin gave appreciation to Frank Rowbotham, John Adams, Fred Wright, Donna Armentano and Paul Simard (also to **Amelia Childs**) for walking at Elm Bank for NE Center for Homeless Vets. About \$1,000 was raised. Tory DeFazio spoke about the Club opportunity to host a Babson MBA student from India for next two years. Vin gave an update on Food Insecurity led by Dede Long. John Adams is hoping the various Visioning Committees are meeting. Andrea Kaiser gave a final report on the Pet Contest. Rotary and its GPEI* partners celebrate a monumental achievement, say global eradication of wild polio is possible with the continued dedication and persistence of Rotarians

*The **GPEI** is a public-private **partnership** led by national governments with six core **partners** – the World Health Organization (WHO), Rotary International, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), UNICEF, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and, most recently, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.

It took tremendous effort over the years. Not detecting any wild poliovirus in Africa is in stark contrast to the situation in 1996 when 75,000 children there were paralyzed by the disease. That year, at a meeting of the Organization of African Unity in Cameroon, African heads of state committed to eradicating the disease from the continent.

To bolster the effort, also in 1996, Rotary, its GPEI partners, and South Africa President **Nelson Mandela** launched the *Kick Polio Out of Africa* campaign. Using soccer matches and celebrity endorsements, the campaign raised awareness of polio and helped more than 30 African countries to hold their first National Immunization Days, Mandela's call to action helped mobilize leaders across the continent to increase their efforts to reach every child with polio vaccine. Since 1996, countless Rotary members from across Africa and around the world have raised funds, immunized *...continued*
