7 were present for President Bill Westerman's opening meeting of his second term (Bill was Wellesley Rotary President in 2019-2020) The Zoom meeting opened with the Pledge followed by Happy Dollars from Westerman, Spoto and Pou. Bill posted an Agenda to orient the members which included a number of organizational and budget ideas for 2022 -2023. Prez Bill and Vin Spoto will meet with the Wellesley Country Club to iron out new billing methods as one meeting per month (second) is planned to be via Zoom and the other (first) be "<u>in person</u>". It is hoped more MBCC students will attend future meetings. Bill is working on a "calendar of meetings: which will include possible speakers. Regarding the Food Insecurity issue at MBCC it was suggested we might work with Framingham Rotary as a partner. Donna Armentano reported \$ 19,860 in the Club Foundation account. She also mentioned budgeted money for Food Insecurity needs to be distributed. It was unknown if donations for the year would include Village Table or not. Vin explained he has received tentative interest in the MBCC "Balance Scholarship" fund to help students who are deficient in the tuition payments.
