President Bill Westerman opened the August 2nd meeting with the Pledge followed by an Invocation by **Toby** Kell. Eleven were present. We welcomed Rotarian Mark Messina from the Weston-Wayland Club and Bob Huttig, Lisa Lodi and Mishawn Davis-Eyene from MassBayCC. *Happy* **Dollars** came from Armentano & Westerman. Bill guided us through the agenda of Club business including Club meetings for the year and arrangements for in-person meetings at the Wellesley Country Club. There was discussion about the menu, and possibly simplifying the offerings to 3 or 4 which would make it easier to order and allow faster billing. The idea is to "speed up the process" and make the meetings more efficient. A little time was spent on the Club Calendar, scheduling meetings and assigning responsibilities. Bill has talked with leaders at the Framingham Rotary about collaborating with the MassBay Balance Scholarship Funds and possibly, the Food Insecurity efforts. Vin Spoto spent time on the Balance Scholarship efforts. There was discussion and questions about the approach for the Fall Semester (which begins Tuesday, September 6th). Mishawn Davis-Evene from MBCC was very helpful in confirming *time* frame (by September 22nd is OK) and fundraising (MBCC has split our \$10K donation to \$5K in the Fall and \$5K in the Spring; Their fundraisers continue from August through September, and they have an Annual Appeal at the end of the year). Discussion then centered on the Club's fundraiser for this year, "Dinner on Us!". Linda Tighe has generously offered to assist Bill with this and will need additional help. It will be a "different team" this year. John Marchionne of the Weston Wayland Rotary has indicated an interest in helping. There was further discussion about lottery rules; copywriting & trademarking the name "DoU!"; need for new lawn signs; larger grand prize, and more use of QR codes. Following the regular meeting there was a Board meeting with 6 in attendance. Treasurer John Adams reviewed the budget for last year and made tentative adjustments for 2022-2023 totaling \$ 37,700. **Donna Armentano**, Club Foundation Treasurer, said that \$ 19,860 was left in that account. Prez Bill has reached out to member Joe Robert of the Community Investors. There was no discussion on Rotary street signs mentioning our former meeting site, Wellesley College Club.
