So join us!

Our meeting at the Wellesley Country Club on August 16th was called to order by President Bill Westerman with 16 present. We welcomed **Dan LaRo**chelle, Pete and JoAnn Jones, Dick Carls, Paul Falcone of Wellesley Media, Robert Huttig and Mishawn Davis-Eyene of Mass Bay as well as our guest speaker, Michael Tobin. Following the Invocation by Toby Kell Prez Bill asked for introductions from our guests. A bevy of *Happy Dollars* came from Spoto, Bevilacqua, Armentano, Westerman, Adams, De Fazio, Carls, Tobin, La Rochelle and a "sad dollar" from Rowbotham ("polio is back!"). It was announced the Club's MBCC Balance Scholarship campaign has raised \$14,200 of which \$10,000 has been transferred to the College. Mishawn reported the need was greater this year with 80 students eligible (up from 31 students in the past). Prez Bill updated us on the planned fundraiser, "Dinner On Us!", and the upcoming meeting in September to support food insecurity at the Village Table. speaker who entitled his talk, "Re-introducing the Wellesley Conservation Land Trust", opening that "green space in addition to location and education makes Wellesley so desirable". He demonstrated this with real estate ads which described homes as "steps to trails, near parkland", etc. Showing a large Natural Resources map he pointed out many conservation areas and trails. He warned that protected land in some cases is temporary and can be overturned and he mentioned the North Forty, Fieldstone Way ("How did this happen?" and, the possible sale of the Hunnewell Farm). He said the town needs a plan to protect against the many loopholes in zoning, making a case for conservation where the state and local regulations play roles. He briefly outlined the WCLT today with its donated parcels of 50 acres. It is getting proactive in looking for additional properties to protect & preserve, to maintain and to educate the public. This includes sanctuaries and easement. "We've been very busy lately." citing recent legal cases, new trails ("Patch of Woods"), activities (Bat Walk at Morses Pond), and a huge interest in town geology. He concluded his talk with suggesting how Rotary and the WCLT might collaborate in the future including handing out "Walks in Wellesley" books on Arbor Day; helping with sanctuary cleanup; engaging children in outdoor programs; identifying land to protect, and co-sponsoring service projects.
