President Linda Tighe opened the meeting with the Pledge followed by an Invocation by **Toby Kell**. *Happy Dollars*: **Kell**, Long, Rowbotham, Bevilacqua, Hayden, Tighe, Westerman & Spoto. Wellesley Rotary has recently contributed \$5K to assist an Afghan family, and \$3K to the District's Ukraine Disaster Relief Fund \$125K. Our next meeting will feature the IFAW and be at the Village Church courtesy of Gary Arthur. Quarterly Rotary meetings at the Village Church begin June 7th to help Gary package meals for the homeless—check the calendar (left) and/or the Club's website. June 21st is the Club's Annual Installation with Bill Westerman taking over the helm. Linda reviewed the upcoming Pooch Parade (5/21) with the need for more marketing to attract dog registrations at \$20 each. Much publicity is needed and fliers and posters (thanks to Vin Spoto) have been circulated. Linda is also looking for more Sponsorships from various groups including tables (15) open for rental during the event. Patrick Hayden has approached the "barketing" department of the Pooch Hotel! making water bowls available, scheduling and process of the Pooch Parade, awards, and Hunnewell Field layout. Linda has ordered the pooch bandanas in Rotary blue and gold. There was also discussion about the Parade (5/22) float. Volunteers are needed. A 50/50 Raffle (Club website) will help in fundraising for the IFAW and all are urged to support. Photos of dogs with owners was discussed and we were pleased to note that Wellesley Media will be present. The rest of our meeting was devoted to our guests who gave an inspirational and informative presentation about MAIA, helping indigenous women in Guatemala to lead a transformational life that lifts them up to leaders in their society....a challenging job!. They talked about "the girl effect", investing in the quality education. These "girl pioneers" are born with difficulties that can only change with inspirational mentoring. They showed a marvelous video of testimonials by these young ladies. Four goals were cited: gain economic independence; arrange for family agreement; dedicate towards 19 years of schooling, and, "empower to empower"- to create leaders. With 43% of Guatemala's population indigenous and the sense of machismo in the culture it is quite a challenge. "Project Launch" received a Rotary Global Grant which has helped launch the program to educated women and add skills to help them survive in a formal economy. They concluded their presentation by seeking \$3,500 from Wellesley Rotary so help support the effort.
