Ten were present (including speaker, Joe Roberts) for our January 9th meeting at MassBay Community College. Following the Pledge we had *Happy Dollars* from **Hayden**, Adams, Roberts, Nelson, Westerman, Armentano and Spoto. Discussion included volunteering at Village Table. Vin Spoto suggested helping out at the Center for Homeless Veterans in Boston. Prez Patrick gave us an update on BOA President Brian Moynihan's presentation at the Wellesley Country Club on Thursday, January 25th. Reservations are now coming in. The goal is to have well over 100 attend. He encouraged building publicity for the event including contacting other Rotary clubs, veterans groups, CR Chamber, Wellesley Neighbors and perhaps Town Meeting members. Joe Roberts suggested contacting the Wellesley Recreation Department. Catherine Doherty will act as Moderator for the event. Representative Alice Peisch is confirmed as speaker for the **Thursday**, March 7th event co-hosted by Wellesley Rotary and the Wellesley Free Library (6:30 PM in the Wakelin Room).

Speaker, Joe Roberts, gave an interesting and complete outline of his *"Community Investors"*, supported by Wellesley Rotary since 2014. He began by describing the current youth epidemics *....continued*

("The Imperfect Storm") which includes a 100% increase in suicidal tendencies among youth; 60% increase in depression; 76% fail to actively play; 70% quit sports by 13 years; and young people spend an average of 7 hours per day looking at their screen!. All this was intensified by COVID. This has been described as "devastating", a national mental health crisis. Community Investors was founded as a 501C3 to empower young people in the spirit of play. This has been endorsed by state & national sources. It gets young people to do things differently by getting them involved in sports. He outlined the goals of C/I as providing student leadership; involving *music-inspired active play*; and, aiming for game-changing innovation. He also mention national "competition", as he described as "bad". Support for his program in Wellesley is growing but not by much. C/I encourages student coaching (kids coaching little kids); music as the heartbeat ("pump it up!") to create fun, and actively manage games with control, energy, balance, sparking passion and help building tradition. It involves 2,500 students annually with 250+ session. But, not everyone is reached. Two specific events include: Flag football at Fenway (He presented a brief video clip); and 1 minute Sizzle Reels known as the "Fenway Remedy" which he hopes will be an annual event. He described other elements of the program as well. He appreciates support for Rep. Alice Peisch. He concluded with his "Game Plan for Success". Our thanks to Joe for an informative talk!
