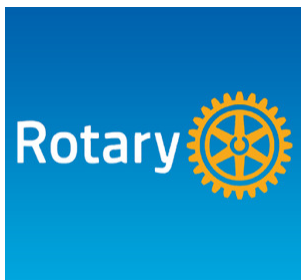

Rotary Peace Fellowship Applications now open!

Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of our peace centers. Since the program began in 2002, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 1,700 fellows who now work in over 140 countries. Many serve as leaders in governments; NGOs; education and research institutions; peacekeeping and law enforcement agencies; and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank. Rotary offers both Masters degrees and professional development certificate programs.

The 2025-26 Rotary Peace Fellowship application is available online through **May 15, 2024**. If you know a potential candidate, use our referral form so they can receive more information. A Peace Fellow candidate does not need to reside in our District. If you know of someone who really wants to make a difference through a commitment to Peace, please let them know about this amazing opportunity.
