Perhaps complementary coffee and dessert should be added. Our thanks to Andrea **Kaiser** for coordinating the event with her thorough well -organized meetings. The photo booth at the entrance was a big success. All-in-all, the event was a great success and ideas and plans for next year have begun. Thank you everyone!

So far in 2024-2025 we have helped fund more than 380 district grants, 770 global grants and 55 disaster response grants. The Rotary Foundation could not support these memberled projects around the world without help from people like you.
