15 were present including three guests (Michelle Biscotti, MBCC Assistant Director of Development, with two associates: Liz Blumberg and Jenny Cavallerano). After the opening Pledge, President Don McCauley received Happy Dollars from Dole, Hayden, Kaiser, McCauley, Nelson, Shaw, Spoto & Westerman.

Michelle opened with introductions

giving their backgrounds and positions at MassBay. She expressed appreciation to Wellesley Rotary for supporting food insecurity at MBCC. 52% of their students struggle with hunger. She delt with how the college is dealing with this, outlining their goals and plans to help students. They receive grants, stage many projects, and "encourage and motivate". She outlined five areas of action: holding a "food market"; offering "hungry" packages; providing fresh fruit and other delicious and nutritious offerings as part of a "grab & go"; reaching out for support for their programs, and offering grocery store gift cards. He also handed out a Wellesley **Rotary Achievement** letter which thanks contributors for their support for *Dinner on Us/Pups in the Park* and Taste of Wellesley in 2025 which raised over \$76,000 for Wellesley Rotary's charities. It also listed Volunteer Opportunities, Community partners, and goals for 2026. A final note of the letter included how one can help achieve our goals in the future.
