President Amelia Schwartzman opened the meeting with the Pledge with 13 in attendance as well as Wellesley Media. It was a dinner meeting in the Library of the Wellesley Country Club. Happy Dollars came from Armentano, DeFazio, Dole, Kaiser, Pou, Rowbotham, Schwartzman, Spoto, Tighe & Westerman. Prez Amelia announced that **Rotarian Don McCauley** has agreed to be the our next Rotary Club President, The installation will take place on Tuesday, June 17th. This was received with a round of applause. Andrea Kaiser gave an update on the upcoming fundraiser, Taste of Wellesley (Wednesday, May 21st). **Donna Armentano** said that \$44,100 had been raised so far towards a goal of \$50K. Linda Tighe gave us an update on the Pups in the *Park* event on Saturday, May 17th as part of Wellesley Wonderful Weekend.

Being that March is Judicial Outreach Month in Massachusetts, Rotarian Nora Pou arranged for Wellesley resident, Judge Diane Cabo Freniere to be our guest speaker. She asked for introductions from the Rotarians so she could gauge her talk accordingly. The Rotarians dutifully complied. She gave a candid talk about her fascinating career leading to the bench. She started as an engineer, went through the Air Force and finally to law school. In 2017 she became a Superior Court judge ....continued

focusing on civil law with some criminal cases. She described some as assault and battery cases, some homicide, and felony cases as they come up through the community district courts (Norfolk County in Dedham and Brockton to mention a couple). "We have a strong judiciary in Massachusetts", she said. She moves around the state as needed to preside over cases where Federal law applies. She discussed some specifics. Litigation can be very expensive and this is affecting the types of cases coming before the judiciary. Focus has been on immigration cases. "The future is unknown here", she said. She has to weigh the impact of the decision in the process. "What is the most favorable juridical decision?" She discussed the impact of the federal courts on the state and the balance of powers. "It can lead to turmoil and be very upsetting for many." Today there is a lot of disrespect for the judiciary which is a fearful situation. The length of the cases can be long. "Timing is important." Judge Freniere also talked about many procedures and processes. She also talked about her family, costs of hiring a lawyer, and getting the right lawyer with the right experience. In the Q& A's she brought up "made-up cases" and how this is a "scary" situation for all. She urged checking for reliability.
