### RECIPE FOR ELEPHANT STEW

1 Elephant (medium size) 2 Rabbits (optional)  
Cut the elephant into small bite size pieces. This should take about two months. Add enough brown gravy to cover. Cook over kerosene fire for about four weeks at 465 degrees.
