PROGRAM - Mr. Leonard Thompson, Boy Scout executive will speak to us about our function in Scouting and present us a charter for Cub Scout Pack 30, Cape Elizabeth, which we sponsor.

Mr. Thompson graduated from Brown University in 1959, and has held positions in Scouting in Providence, R. I., Gardner, Mass., and Hartford, Conn.

LAST WEEK - Club Finances - Present annual dues are \$25, the minimum prescribed for any Rotary Club. These have been in effect since the club was chartered, and are no longer adequate to meet our internal needs. After many meetings, discussing the financial aspects of our club, the Board of Directors has recommended two plans for consideration by the club members.

Plan #1 - Increase annual dues from \$25 to \$35, an increase of \$10.

This will result in extra needed revenue of approximately \$500.

Plan #2 - \$160 per year per member payable quarterly to cover the following:

Dues	- \$ 25
Ladies Night	- \$ 15
50 Meals @ \$2.50	- \$125 (reg. wkly mtgs.)
	<u>\$165</u>

Each member who makes up at another club, will receive a credit of \$2.00 against the \$125. Every meeting a member misses, the regular \$2.50 meal charge will be forfeited. It is estimated that the \$.50 forfeited on each make-up and the \$2.50 forfeited on each missed meeting will raise an amount close to Plan #1 or \$500 annually. This plan has been used successfully in other clubs, and has resulted in better attendance, and increased activity of its members.

Your directors have requested your thoughtful consideration of each of these plans, with a vote on May 24th for your choice of either Plan #1 or Plan #2. If unable to attend this meeting, please send your vote to Ron Tripp, Secretary, prior to the 24th.

At the meeting last week many thoughts and opinions were expressed which are important before agreement of all members. A short time was also spent discussing a recommendation to set aside a sizeable amount of each year's external budget, in order to work toward a larger, more worthwhile project. Each of the past years we have given many smaller amounts from our project fund. The important ones would be continued.

PROJECT FOR JUNE - Guy Lombardo and his Royal Canadians have been engaged by our directors for a dance at the Portland Exposition Building, on Friday evening, June 23rd from 8:30 - 12 P.M. To guarantee the success of this dance, as our Spring project, every member is asked to sell 15 tickets. Tickets will be \$10 per couple. Five couples at each table - placed cabaret style around the floor.

Keith Dennison has your tickets if you were not present to receive same.
