### PROGRAM

BOB CHAMBERS will introduce our guest speaker for the evening, Louis Doyle, who is associated with the Bureau of Human Relations Service, Catholic Diocese of Portland. He is a native of Boston, a graduate of Boston University, and received his Masters of Education at Harvard. He has been a teacher, including Waynflete, and headed the Community Action Program in Kentucky (this program was curtailed because of a cut in Federal Funds). Mr. Doyle then came to Maine, joining the Bureau, concentrating on the problems of the Maine Indians. The topic of the speaker will be, "Indians are People".

### LAST WEEK

Dick Hewes, Representative from South Portland-Cape Elizabeth, commented on "The Sales Tax". It was interesting to note, from Mr. Hewes' handouts, where revenue is obtained, namely the Federal Government and Sales Use Taxes. Because of the limited taxpayers - 368,000 in 1968, with 100,200 people earning \$5,000 - \$10,000 (30%), 20,240 people earning \$10,000 or more (6%), and 221,500 earning \$5,000 or less (64%), our speaker indicated he is against an income tax (personal-state). Questions and answers completed a good give and take evening.
