
### ROTARIAN OF THE WEEK

FRANK ALLEN, a fellow Rotarian from Portland Rotary gave us the subject of Antiques as an Investment. Guess we have to know what we are doing to do anything in this life.

DID YOU KNOW: About 200 years ago the British strategy at Bunker Hill was to attack the Colonials, create panic and then march to Cambridge and capture the Colonial headquarters and stores.

Action began at 4 AM when the British fleet saw a small fortress had been constructed during the night at Breeds Hill.

A total of 200 cannons from six major ships and land batteries kept up a continuous bombardment on the Colonial positions.

The British Infantry was part of the best army in Europe, however, the Colonials had a large number of 'retreads' from the French and Indian War.

General Howe planned his main attack on the Colonials rear flank, but the Colonials recognized this shortcoming in their defenses and took immediate steps to rectify the situation. Two hundred men were dispatched to put together a line of logs, rocks and hay - later known as the "Rail Fence". General Howe did not attack until 3:30 PM and therefore, gave the Colonials the entire day to improve their defenses....

Three orders were issued to the Colonial troops (1) Do not fire until you see the whites of their eyes. (2) Fire Low. This improved chances of hitting some part of the body. (3) Aim at the fine coats. This meant the officers (leaders) were the prime targets.

Magnificent courage was displayed on both sides. The Battle of Bunker Hill broke the offensive power of the British Army and they never again attacked an earthworks defensive position in Boston.

George Washington, coming from Philadelphia, was told of the loss of Bunker Hill, but upon hearing the details of the battle he said, "the liberties of our country are safe."






