However through hard work Logan was the first airport in the United States to be certified.

Meeting May 4, 1977

President Dick called meeting to order promptly at 6:15 p.m.

Les Waters led us in the opening ode and invocation was given by Paul Chantal. Five visiting Rotarians were present at the meeting. Following dinner, Dick Day, with help from Lloyd Knight, led us in song.

Program

Rod Dyer, pinch hitting for Dick Pyne, introduced Bill Edmundson, Executive Director of Portland and South Portland Boy's Clubs.

Bill told us both clubs are exactly the same and have the same administrative staff. Projected building cost \$700,000 including pool. Drive was not too successful and swimming pool construction had to be eliminated. Only 44% of money raised came from South Portland based firms and citizenry. General Electric and Fairchild did not contribute. In order to continue operations of South Portland Boy's Club money had to be taken from endowments.

United Fund has promised to pay \$125,000 in 1977 and 1978. This will still cause a deficit of \$12,000.00 each one of those years. Because of this a fund raising project will have to be inaugurated.

Mr. Edmundson stated best way for Service Clubs to donate funds is to earmark money for specific items. If certain finances are not forthcoming some decision will have to be made pertaining to closing one of the clubs.

In survival there are five key ingredients which can be recalled as important. "Key is the letters F F S S F" which stand for 1. First Aid; 2. Fire; 3. Signals; 4. Shelter; 5. Food. Man can survive with no food but must have water.

There are also some theories which one must keep in mind in order to survive.

1. Be Stubborn. 2. Take care of Basic Needs. 3. Make definite plans and set goals. 4. Remember to use all Survival Equipment. 5. Try to recall past experiences so they can be utilized.

The talk was most interesting and Acting President Les thanked participants for their excellent program presentation.

Dr. Bill Talbot, who is a yachtsman told us about his experiences with the ship Gazella, which took part in the March of the Tall Ships.

Dr. Talbot said the boat was purchased by a Philadelphia philanthropist from Portugal. Dr. Talbot sailed the boat from Portugal to Philadelphia and then on to Bermuda, Newport, and New York during the 1976 Bicentennial celebration.

Gazella was the smallest ship to take part in the festivities and was the only ship made of wood.

Gazella almost did not make it to Newport as she was in a collision prior to the start of the Bermuda to Newport race. Gazella was built in 1883 and was not taken from fishing service until about 15 years ago.

After a short explanation Dr. Talbot showed us a slide film presentation which was excellent, not only showing photos of Gazella but other more affluent boats that took part from all parts of the world.

Program

Program Chairman Dick Pyne introduced Rev. Birger Johnson, Chaplain at the Maine Youth Center, also involved in Public Relations. The program was given in two sequences - one an interview between the Psychologist and an inmate. The second part was a slide presentation of the program and plant layout at the Maine Youth Center.

Interview - This particular youth involved in the interview had been at Training Center several times and his rehabilitation prognosis is poor. At 9 years of age he began stealing cigarettes and indulged in smoking. Around 11-12 years of age he became involved in vandalism and as he grew older his pattern of behavior became more aggressive and hostile and with this the magnitude of his offenses increased as well.

For home life this was very limited. The family was quite mobile as father was in the service and on some weekends he would not come home at all. This caused some disruption in the family constellation and as a result this particular youth could not cope with the problem.

At conclusion of interview youth stated he wanted to leave the Youth Center and start anew but his future did not appear bright.

Slide presentation - This was a general pictorial overview of the Youth Center. The slides concentrated on showing the physical plant as well as constructive programming for youths both male and female.

The average stay at the Maine Youth Center because of overcrowding is between 5 and 6 months.
