MEETING - JULY 6, 1977

Club was assembled and the meeting was called to order at 6:15. Bill Stanton gave the invocation. Dick Pyne led us in a verse of America. After dinner G. Chandler introduced three visiting Rotarians and one guest for the evening. Sam Giftos led the group singing.

The Business Meeting was called to order at 6:50. President D. Jenis gave a rundown of the policies and activities that he hoped would be instituted and held during his term of office. Club officers G. Chandler, A. Keniston, R. Carson, A. Boudreau were called on to give a brief report of the coming year's activities. Committee Assignments were passed out to the members. R. Carson proposed an increase in the dues from \$60 to \$75. The increased income would be used to pay for the rent of the meet-ing hall. Currently, the members are assessed on their dinner tab for the meeting hall rent. This amount would be reduced in the cost of dinner to the members. After discussion was held on this item, S. Giftos made a motion to increase the dues to \$75. It was seconded by M. Smith. Motion was voted unanimously and accepted. President Don reported that the board of directors had voted in a \$300 Consolation Scholarship for candidates who were nominated to represent us in the district competition but did not win. D. Pyne gave a report on the South Portland-Cape Elizabeth Rotary District Convention Fund. There are 25 active members in the fund. He made an appeal to members that are planning to go to the convention and are not in the fund to invest in the fund so that the club could get the benefit of the income. D. Kilroy proposed that the club start a fund to raise \$1000 and designate a Paul Harris Fellow. He donated \$500 to start the fund off, if the amount was matched by the club. Ray Frost responded with another \$100 donation.

MEETING - July 20, 1977



- 4. Special Report Method of Electing a New Member Director C. Cyr covered the procedure involved in electing a new member. Briefly it is as follows: Proposal to elect a person as a new member must be made in writing on an application card to the Board of Directors. This must be done before the candidate has been contacted directly. The Board of Directors will have application referred to two committees for their action. The Classification committee acts on the eligibility from a classification standpoint. The Membership committee acts on eligibility of the candidate from a standpoint of Character, business and social standing. Final action will be taken by the board on the recommendations of the committees. If the action is favorable, the candidate's name is posted before the club for ten days. At the conclusion of the waiting period if no objections are filed the application is turned over to the Rotary Information Committee. This committee meets with the prospective new member and informs him of the privileges and responsibilities of membership. If the candidate agrees to assume them he is invited to join the club. The new member fills out an application and this is turned over to the club.
- 5.**Special Report Paul Harris Fund Drive President Don reported two new subscribers to the fund, D. Kennedy and W. Simpson \$25, this brought the total up to \$725, a long way from our \$1000 goal prior to H. Fralich's departure. Then in a burst of enthusiasm triggered by a plea to the club and S. MEETING - JULY 27, 1977







Jack and his wife, Doris, have two married daughters, Libby who resides with her family in Andover, Mass., and Marny and family who resides in Dover, Delaware.





Dick Day has resigned, because of a change in business.


