Meeting presided over by Don Jenis. Invocation by Dick Kennedy, Songs by Ray Frost, and visiting Rotarians introduced by George Chandler.

Make Ups: 10/18 Al DiMatteo at Newburyport, Mass. 10/28 Frank Hugo at St. Petersburg, Florida. 10/31 Bill Stanton at Brunswick.

Mason Smith announced that a friend from France told him that Pierre Bourgeoise, when he arrived back home around 5 p.m., spent an hour and a half on the phone telling what a great time he had with us. A good experience all around.

Following his practice of giving a short talk on Rotary rules etc., President Don spoke on the method of selecting club officers. This can come from a nominating committee and from the floor. In our club the nominating committee is made up of the past presidents who will submit a slate and we then may have nominations from the floor. Don also announced that the board of directors will be inviting a guest to come to each meeting. This in line with his campaign to obtain new members. Go and do likewise.

Our speaker, introduced by program chairman Bill Stanton, was Jim Pierce of Moseley Hallgarten & Estabrook Investment Brokers. Jim is a graduate of Gov. Dummer Academy and Bowdoin College. He spoke on the subject of investing money to provide the best return in relation to ones taxable income.

With a taxable income of \$25,000 one pays a federal tax of 6,000 and a state tax of 1200. At \$50,000 taxable income it goes up to \$17,000 federal and \$3,400 to the state. Above \$50,000 federal takes 50% and state, 10%.

By investing in municipal bonds either general obligation or revenue type ones return is free from federal tax. Maine does tax all but Maine bonds.

Jim also spoke of tax shelters. In this case one invests before tax money and is permitted to deduct the investment in three years. This in effect means that Uncle Sam is putting up half the money (50 % bracket). Returns from this type of shelter are taxed as follows: the first third is completely tax free with the remaining two-thirds taxed as regular income. This looks like a very good deal to me. Wish I was in that bracket and could try it.

This week's meeting is at Merry Manor and is a ladies night, in honor of District Governor Harold Fralich's visit to our club. This is his 50th district visit and should be a real good time. President Don promises some surprises. This should include the announcing of our latest Paul Harris Fellow.

More on Al Boudreau's Shadowing Program. We have ten applicants of whom five are already placed. One has completed his Shadowing time which was at G.E. sponsored by Don Jenis and was a computer science program which lasted 3 hours. From all reports it worked out fine. Other applicants are interested in such things as Journalism, Fashion Merchandising, Fashion Design, Photography, and Veterinary Medicine. We will keep you posted as the program unfolds. This is a fine thing for our club to be doing.

THIS WEEK: Unsure of program at press time.

LAST WEEK: Invocation by Dick Kennedy, Songs by Lloyd Knight, visiting Rotarians introduced by George Chandler.

President Don spoke of the importance of attendance and Rotary's rules which govern it. Rules say that 60% attendance is a must. A letter from District Governor Harold Fralich was read. It expressed his appreciation for the fine evening at the Merry Manor on the occasion of his official visit to our club.

Dick Kilroy also expressed his appreciation for our selecting him as our Rotary Paul Harris Fellow and Warren Simpson announced that we are in need of a lot of "Give Away" stuff for the convention next spring. There are expected to be 500 people in attendance so we need enough for that many people. If you have access to pens, pencils, book matches, key rings etc., bring them in to Warren.

Our annual Christmas party will be held at our December 21 meeting.

Bill Stanton introduced Stan Ladd of Union Mutual Insurance Co. who spoke on the high cost of health care. Just a few years ago a group health policy paying 80% of up to \$5,000 cost 8.22 per month per family. Today the top limit is \$1,000,000 and the cost runs to 100 per month for a family. Hospital costs for room and board have risen 42% since 1975. Stan said that fringe benefits are now costing employers 35% and are rising. He predicts National Health Care for the early 80s and says that the reason Medicare is such a mess is that the private insurance companies failed to face the situation and the Federal Government stepped in. He said that in many cities the hospitals are trying to eliminate duplicate coverage and have each hospital specialize in the area it does best. This would help to stem the rising tide of health cost. Union Mutual is the 8th oldest insurance company in the country and is the fastest growing one. It pays out benefits at the rate of \$5 per second.
