LAST WEEK: Don Jenis presided, invocation by Warren Simpson, songs by Captain Lloyd (real tear jerkers).

Don announced that there will be a Directors meeting at his home next Monday, January 9, at 7:30 PM. He also announced that, in his travels, District Governor Harold has had sums of money given to him to use as he saw fit and Harold has decided to turn over to our club some \$275 toward our next Paul Harris Fellowship. This amount added to the \$125 we had left from our last one gives us a total of \$400 toward another Fellowship. Thank you very much, Harold.

MEMBERSHIP CONTEST: Charlie Cyr and George Chandler have divided the Club into two teams for a Membership Contest which will last for the next three months. It has not been decided what the winners will receive but I am sure it will cost the losers so let's get about bringing in some new members.

PROGRAM: Paul Butler introduced Mrs. Betty Berry who is Executive Director for the Campfire Girls in this area. She has a staff of five paid people and 200 volunteers and an annual budget of \$80,000. Campfire differs from Scouting in that it does not stress competition but rather operates with small groups and encourages each individual to move in his own direction at his own speed. Campfire owns a very nice camp site in Scarborough with Recreation rooms, Arts & Crafts rooms, swimming facilities and winter sports in this season. Mrs. Berry has just started an outreach program at Redbank. This is directed toward children in the fourth, fifth and sixth grades who return from school to an empty home with no supervision until the supper hour. There are no facilities for these kids and many just hang around and often wind up in trouble. Campfire has started a program for these kids at the Redbank School. It is a year round after school program half time at the school and half at the camp in Scarborough. The kids will be encouraged to perform some services for the community such as shoveling for older folks etc. Mrs. Berry needs money to keep the program operating for the first year and is approaching all the service clubs looking for help. This seems like a big ounce of prevention to me and I sincerely hope that our Rotary Club Directors can find some way to help in this very worthy cause.

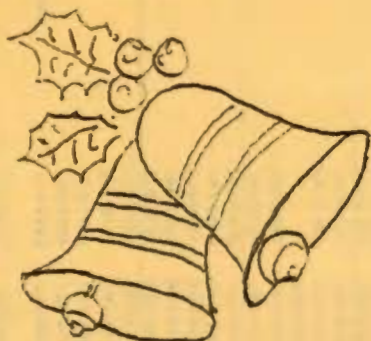

From preliminary reports it looks as if we had a most successful Tree Sale. Sold out the Sunday before Christmas, the shack put away and the grounds raked up. It looks as if we will have a profit of about \$4,000.

Our annual Christmas Party was a huge success in spite of the bad weather. We had very few cancellations and those who attended had a very nice time. Our thanks to Keith Dennison for a fine job.

Dick Pyne reminds us that the Convention fund has only 22 weeks to go. If you are behind now is a good time to catch up.

Rod Dyer introduced the program, the speaker being Ralph B. Osgood, Jr. who spoke on the new system of handling Medicare "B" claims in the State of Maine. Since the inception of this program until Dec. 1 of 1977 this chore has been handled by Union Mutual of Portland. The resigned and the government put the program out to bid. Mass. Blue Shield won the contract for a period of three years and is now operating from offices in the Monument Square Building. There are 140,000 recipients of the service in Maine. Medicare part "A" costs the retired people nothing and covers hospitalization services. Medicare part "B" is optional and costs approximately \$8.00 per month and covers professional medical services rendered outside a hospital. It was apparent from the question period that many medical and insurance people are not too happy to have an out of state company handling these claims for Maine people.
