MAN FROM LA MANCHA: If anyone still has money to be turned in please get it to Bill York or Bill Brown.





Language Club trip to Quebec, \$1000 to Cape anti drug program, sent three boys to National AAU meet, \$750 to Rotary Int. HHH fund, enlisted many good new members, had a tremendous christmas tree sale, and Man from La Mancha. Our congratulations to you, George, on a fine year and a job well done.

Incoming Pres. Al Boudreau, briefly outlined the Quebec conference saying that Sam Giftos is now in his 6th year as District Treasurer and that Harold Fralich received a Rotary Foundation award citing him for his unstinting work for Rotary International. 



MEETING OF 8/29; This will be at the Sheraton. Should we decide to meet at the Sheraton regularly, we would be offered, for ourselves and our families, pool privileges, sauna, lockers room, and discounts on rooms. Price at the Sheraton will be 6.60.

The buyer also can usually get a lower premium by having his various policies consolidated into one. He also pointed out that we can help beat the rising cost of insurance by increasing our deductibles, both on automobile and homeowners policies. He also suggested that we look at our policies to determine how much liability coverage we have as juries are awarding very high amounts these days. If we do not have adequate coverage and have the misfortune to be sued, it could tie up our credit for three or four years and possibly wipe us out. Give it some thought.





Pres. Al read a letter of resignation from Mason Smith. We always hate to lose a good member.


NEW MEETING PLACE: After discussing the four places we have met in the past month a vote was taken and, as a result, we will be meeting at the Bridgeway.
